TASTING NOTE

2016 OAKDENE SHIRAZ



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Appearance

Deep garnet in colour.

Bouquet

Ripe and meaty with lifted blackberry and dark plum notes, white pepper and spice.

Palate

The palate is dominated by dark red fruits and cool-grown spice leading to a soft and elegant, medium body, fine tannin and balanced acidity.

Conclusion

Drink now or over the next 2 to 8 years.

Technical Analysis Vineyard Location

Drysdale, Bellarine Peninsula, Geelong, Victoria, Australia

Climate

Maritime climate moderated by Bass Strait to the south, the Rip at Port Phillip Heads to the east, Swan Bay and Port Phillip bay to the North, and the Barwon River to the west.

Soils

Moderate draining loam over a clay loam subsoil

Vertical shoot positioning (VSP)

2.7 tonnes per acre 1000 dozen

Fermentation

Shiraz was destemmed, and then fermented in small open vats. Pressed to barrel for malolactic fermentation, and matured in French oak barriques (10% new) for 11 months, then bottled in February 2017.
