TASTING NOTE

2019 OAKDENE 'PETA'S' PINOT NOIR



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Appearance

Deep purple/garnet in colour.

Bouquet

A lifted bouquet of stewed cherry, spice and savoury aromas.

Palate

Intense mid-palate by cherry rhubarb notes. French oak and whole bunches adding a savoury element to the wine, with clove, redcurrant, woodsmoke and twiggy notes. Amaro like acidity and ample tannin offer balance and length.

Conclusion

Enjoy now with food or cellar for the next 5 to 10 years.

Climate

Maritime climate moderated by Bass Strait to the south, the Rip at Port Phillip Heads to the east, Swan Bay and Port Phillip bay to the North, and the Barwon River to the west.

Fermentation

Hand harvested fruit was destemmed, with 20% included as whole bunches, then with 8 – 10 days maceration on skins fermentation was started using wild yeast in a small open vat for 6 days reaching 30 degrees. The wine was pressed to barrel for malolactic fermentation was matured in 225 litre French oak barriques (30% new) for 12 months prior to bottling in February 2020.
